



Racer Code of Conduct

Intermountain Snowmobile Racing aims to provide a fun and safe introduction to snowmobile racing for the youth. All race events are run in accordance with IMR and ISSR rules. In addition to these rules, our code of conduct (below) provides clear guidance on acceptable behavior for our racers.

We expect all racers to:

- Arrive for racing events in good time to register and take part in warm up and riders meetings.
- Wear safety gear at all times if you are riding your snowmobile in the pits, in the staging area, hot box area, and starting line. See safety rules.
- Be on time for your practice and races.
- Play by the rules and do not argue with the officials.
- Make sure you are in control at all times of your snowmobile.
- Be honest and be responsible for your own actions.
- Respect the decisions of event officials, and obey any instructions given by officials.
- Be a good sport towards all participants.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants.
- Treat all participants in racing as you would like to be treated. Show consideration for other racers, officials, parents, and spectators.
- Thank officials and opponents after competitions.
- Show good manners in public.

We are very serious about the Racer Code of Conduct. Good or bad behavior of an individual racer reflects on the racing program as a whole. Being a part of this racing program is a privilege, not a right. IMR reserves the right to issue a warning, suspend, or exclude a racer from future events who is deemed by the organizers to be in breach of this code of conduct.
